# FROM THE BOARD CHAIR & EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Dear Board of Directors and Senior Fellow Network.

We are delighted to present this report on the state of the American Leadership Forum of Oregon. In the past two years ALF Oregon has experienced incredible change, marked by resuming in-person programming, leadership and staff transition, and significant programming achievements around inclusion, equity, and access.

Our signature Fellows Program continues to attract phenomenal leaders from across the state. These are leaders, nominated by you, who are intentionally brought together and whose paths may never have otherwise crossed. We now have 850+ Senior Fellows statewide and will be graduating Classes 43 and 44 this May. We have so much to celebrate!

The Board of Directors have recently established new committees, allowing us to better support the organization and leverage the expertise of our board members. As we look ahead, we are excited to build upon the successes of the past year. Our focus remains the same: to deliver a powerful and impactful statewide Fellows experience and to excel at connecting leaders across difference and build their individual and collective capacity for principled conflict and dialogue.

Even though ALF Oregon is an established 38-year old nonprofit, we are also an adaptive and evolving organization. Depending on when you went through the program, the content has likely changed. We often hear Senior Fellows say, "ALF today is nothing like the ALF I went through." And it's true. The founders of ALF Oregon built this organization to be fluid and responsive so that we could move with the times and support leaders as they face new and emergent challenges. As we continue to grow, we are also keenly aware of whose shoulders we stand upon. ALF founder Joe Jaworski wrote, "We can't take the United States the way it was handed to us. We've got to rebuild with each generation." ALF Oregon continues to be a place where we rebuild and practice relational leadership.

As we welcome the new year, please know how deeply grateful we are for your leadership, your commitment, and for your support. In May 2024, ALF Oregon will host our annual Reunion. We hope to see you all there. ALF needs you. This is our time.

# THE LAST TWO YEARS

## 2022

## Return to In-Person Programming & Leadership Transition

After a year of online programming during the height of the Covid 19 pandemic, ALF Oregon returned to inperson programming the summer of 2021. Classes 39 and 40 gathered throughout the state with a robust testing and masking protocol. The ALF Oregon team developed and practiced a new mutual care model to keep cohort members and visiting speakers safe.

In May, ALF Executive Director Lisa Watson left her position to join Senior Fellow Carmen Rubio at the City of Portland in the office of Equity and Human Rights.

ALF Oregon's Program Manager Kelley Whitmore stepped in as Interim Executive Director and launched Classes 41 and 42. The Board began their search for new leadership.

# 2023

#### Enhanced Communication, Updated Facilitation Model & Expanded Accessibility

In October of 2022, the ALF Oregon Board hired Sarah Greenman (Class 40) as Executive Director. Sarah is ALF Oregon's first rural leader.

In January, Toni Tabora-Roberts joined Cliff Jones and Nancy Davis as ALF Faculty. The transition to a co-facilitation model expanded the scope, diversity, and efficacy of program delivery.

In July, ALF Oregon launched a new website and secured funding in partnership with ALF National for a new Senior Fellow directory and database.

In August, Classes 43 and 44 gathered for Community Building Week in a new-to-us trauma-informed venue that provided greater accessibility.

Lisa Watson (Class 30) came to ALF in the summer of 2019. She stepped in during a time of great transition for the organization and led with strategy, forsight, and a lot of heart.

During the early months of the pandemic, she worked closely with Kelley Whitmore and Senior Fellows to create online peergroups and affinity spaces for the Senior Fellow Network. She also led Classes 37 and 38 through a potent year of online programming.

Lisa Watson's final act was to lead a hybrid Reunion in May of 2022 that left ALF Oregon in the green and poised for new leadership. Thank you, Lisa!






